

CHAPTER 15

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Part 1

General Regulations

§101. Definitions and Interpretation.

Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, as now in force, or as hereafter amended, enacted or reenacted, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

The term “legal holidays” as used in this ordinance shall mean and include: New Year’s Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

In this ordinance, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

§102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances, or as amendments to this chapter.

§103. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

The Mayor shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:

1. In case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations;
2. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
3. In and around the public playground on the following streets: N. Lynn, Russell Avenue, Stanely Avenue, to establish temporary traffic and or parking regulations when winter conditions require such regulations for the safety of the public.

Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Mayor and the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or

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who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in part 6 of this chapter.

§104. Experimental Regulations.

The Borough Council may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the highways in the Borough where for a period of time not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, restrictions and prohibitions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, restriction, or prohibition, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this section.

§105. Authority of Police Officers.

The police officers of the Borough are hereby given authority to direct traffic on the highways of the Borough and at intersections thereof.

Part 2

Traffic Regulations

§201. Motor Vehicles Not to be Driven on Sidewalks.

No person shall drive any vehicle except a human powered vehicle upon a sidewalk or sidewalk area except upon a permanent or duly authorized temporary driveway.

§202. Speed Limits Established.

The following speed limits are hereby established:

Street	Between	Speed Limit
Broadway	Bethlehem City Line and Salisbury Line	30 m.p.h.
Graham Street	Tombler Street and Dodson Street	25 m.p.h.
Other streets	–	25 m.p.h.

Any person who shall operate a vehicle at a speed in excess of that established therefor, upon any highway or portion thereof as specified in this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35 and, for exceeding a maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour, shall pay an additional fine of \$2 for each mile per hour in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§203. Traffic Signals at Certain Intersections.

At the following intersections, official traffic signals shall be erected (or if heretofore erected are hereby ratified), and traffic at such intersections shall be directed by such signals:

Intersection

- Delaware Avenue and Broadway
- Delaware Avenue and St. Luke’s Place

§205. Stop Intersections.

The following intersections are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are hereby confirmed if heretofore erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions hereby indicated. All vehicles approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions hereby indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such intersection:

§206. Unlawful to Operate Motor Vehicles on Streets Closed for Construction or Repair.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle upon any street in the Borough that is under construction, resurfacing or repair, in disregard of any official sign, barricade or notice that the same is closed to vehicular traffic.

§207. Play Streets Authorized.

The Mayor is hereby authorized to designate as play streets, whenever he shall deem such action advisable, and for whatever period of time directed by him, any portion of any street in the Borough whereon sledding and coasting shall be permitted. Such streets shall be set apart for this purpose under the direction of the Mayor.

No person shall operate any motor vehicle upon any play street at any time when such street shall be so designated, except in case of emergency, with special permission of the police officer in charge, who shall first clear the play street of all persons using such street for the purpose for which it was set aside.

§208. Gross Weight Limits Established.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive, park or stand any motor vehicle or other vehicle, trailer or tractor-trailer combination having a gross weight in excess of that herein prescribed, upon any of the following streets or portions thereof where such streets or portions thereof have been posted with notice of such maximum weight:

Provided: the aforesaid weight limit shall not apply to any motor vehicle or other vehicle, trailer or tractor-trailer combination making deliveries or picking up goods, wares, material or merchandise from any property located upon any such restricted zone, or any motor vehicle or any other vehicle, trailer or tractor-trailer combination for which a special permit to operate in any such restricted zone shall have been issued by the Chief of Police.

Provided further: the provisions of this section shall not apply to the driving of vehicles hauling food or household goods, public utility vehicles, fire-fighting equipment, garbage and rubbish vehicles, or school and public transportation buses.

§209. Right Turn on Red Signal Prohibited at Certain Intersections.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle traveling on the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case to make a right turn when his or her vehicle is faced by a steady red traffic signal:

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§210. Driving and Parking of Motor Vehicles in Lechauweki Springs Park.

1. No person may drive or park a motor vehicle on, into or upon Lechauweki Springs Park except for the limited purpose set forth in this section, and except for municipal employees on municipal business.
2. A person may drive a motor vehicle into Lechauweki Springs Park with a handicapped person or persons as a passenger or passengers for the sole purpose of dropping off or picking up such person or persons. Such vehicle shall enter and leave on Lechauweki Avenue extension at or about its intersection with Moravia Street and shall follow the signs to a designated parking place marked "Handicapped Dropoff/Parking."
3. A handicapped person with an HP or DV license plate issued by a Department of Transportation may drive a motor vehicle into Lechauweki Springs Park for the sole purpose of access and enjoyment of the park by the handicapped person. Such vehicle shall enter and leave on Lechauweki Avenue extension at or about its intersection with Moravia Street and shall follow the signs to a designated parking place marked "Handicapped Dropoff/Parking."
4. For the purpose of this section, a handicapped passenger shall be a person that does not have full use of a leg or both legs, and requires the use of a wheelchair, walker, crutches, quadcane or other such device, or cannot walk 100 feet without adverse health effects or severe physical discomfort.
5. Any person driving or parking a motor vehicle in Lechauweki Springs Park other than as authorized in this section shall be given a traffic ticket or citation assessing a fine in the amount of \$50. If the fine is not paid to the Borough voluntarily, then, upon conviction before a District Magistrate, such person shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$300, together with costs of prosecution.

Part 3

Parking Violations

§301. Parking Without Lights Authorized.

The boundary limits of the Borough are hereby established as a zone in which motor vehicles may remain standing without lights, and all highways within such boundary limits are hereby designated as highways where motor vehicles may remain standing without lights.

§302. Prohibitions in Specified Places.

General Rule. Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to protect the safety of any person or vehicle or in compliance with law or the direction of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall:

- A. Stop, stand or park a vehicle:
 - (1) On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street.
 - (2) On a sidewalk.
 - (3) Within an intersection.
 - (4) On a crosswalk.
 - (5) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by official traffic control devices.
 - (6) At any place where official signs prohibit stopping.
- B. Stand or park any vehicle:
 - (1) In front of a public or private driveway.
 - (2) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
 - (3) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.
 - (4) Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway.

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- (5) Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station or, when properly sign posted, on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within 75 feet of the entrance.
- (6) At any place where official signs prohibit standing.

C. Park a vehicle:

- (1) At any place where official signs prohibit parking, including but not limited to temporary signs indicating street cleaning and/or special events.
 - * A schedule of the locations where official signs have been authorized by action of Borough Council appears at the end of this Part 3 as Schedule 1.
- (2) At any place where a special purpose parking zone has been established, including but not limited to patient parking zones.
 - * A schedule of the locations where special purpose parking zones have been authorized by action of Borough Council appears at the end of this Part 3 as Schedule 2.
- (3) At any place where handicapped parking spaces have been designated.
 - * A schedule of the locations where handicapped parking spaces have been authorized by action of Borough Council appears at the end of this Part 3 as Schedule 3.

§303. Additional Parking Regulations.

1. Two-Way Highways. Except as otherwise provided in this section, every vehicle standing or parked upon a two way highway shall be positioned parallel to the curb or edge of the highway with its right-hand wheels within 12 inches of the right-hand curb or, in the absence of a curb, as close as practicable to the right edge of the right-hand shoulder.
2. One-Way Highways. Except as otherwise provided in this section, every vehicle standing or parked upon a one-way highway shall be positioned parallel to the curb or edge of the highway in the direction of authorized traffic movement with its right-hand wheels within 12 inches of the right-hand curb, or in the absence of a curb, as close as practicable to the right edge of the right-hand shoulder, or with its left-hand wheels within 12 inches of the left-hand curb, or in the absence of a

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curb, as close as practical to the left edge of the left-hand curb, as close as practical to the left edge of the left-hand shoulder.

§304. Parking Limit for Certain Types of Vehicles.

No person shall park any vehicle over 10,000 pounds in weight, or allow the same to remain parked, on any street or alley in the Borough, for a period longer than 18 hours without the permission of the Police Department.

§305. Blocking Garages.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time in front of, opposite to or in such a position as to block entrance to or exit by a vehicle from a garage.

§306. Loading and Unloading.

The loading and unloading of goods, wares, and merchandise is hereby restricted to such length of time as is absolutely necessary for the purpose of loading or unloading of such goods, wares and merchandise. For the purpose of enforcement of this section, such loading or unloading of any vehicle shall not be considered as parking; provided that, without having first obtained permission from the Chief of Police of the Borough to do so, no person shall load or unload a vehicle from any place upon any street or alley in the Borough where parking is prohibited; or shall allow a vehicle to remain, for loading or unloading, in any place upon any street or alley where parking is limited as to time, for longer than the time for which parking is permitted; or shall load or unload upon any street or alley in such a way that one lane for vehicular traffic shall not be kept open at all times. Where such permission is granted, the Chief of Police, at his discretion, may block off the portion of the street or alley affected by such loading or unloading.

§307. Unattached Trailer.

No person shall park a truck trailer or trailer upon any street without having attached thereto a means of mechanical traction so constructed or designed for the purpose of rolling or drawing such trailer.

§308. Penalty.

The owner of any vehicle parked so as to violate any provision of this Part 3 shall be given a traffic ticket or citation assessing a fine in the following amounts:

- A. For any violation of §302, 303 or 305, except as provided hereinbelow, the owner of a vehicle shall pay a fine of \$15 within seven days of the violation; thereafter, until a citation is issued, \$25.
- B. For parking within a crosswalk in violation of §302(A)(4) or parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant in violation of §302(B)(2), the owner of a vehicle shall pay a fine of \$20 within seven days of the violation; thereafter, until a citation is issued, \$30.
- C. For parking any place where an official sign prohibits parking in violation of §302(C)(1) or 302(C)(2), the owner of a vehicle shall pay a fine of \$20 within seven days of the violation; thereafter, until a citation is issued, \$30.
- D. For any violation of §§307 and 309, the owner of a vehicle shall pay a fine of \$15 within seven days of the violation; thereafter, until a citation is issued, \$25.
- E. For parking in a handicapped zone without proper authorization, the owner of a vehicle shall pay a fine of \$50 within seven days of the violation; thereafter, until a citation is issued, \$75.
- F. If the fines herein are not paid to the Borough voluntarily by the owner of the vehicle violating the provisions as hereinabove set forth, then, upon conviction before any District Justice having jurisdiction, such owner shall be sentenced to pay a fine in the amounts designated above, together with costs of prosecution.

§309. Unlawful to Park Inoperative, Uninspected or Unregistered Vehicles.

It shall be hereinafter unlawful to park or leave on the streets or highways or public property of the Borough of Fountain Hill for more than 96 hours mechanically inoperable vehicles, or vehicles without current inspection stickers, or vehicles without current registration.

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§310. Unlawful to Perform Major Motor Vehicle Repairs.

It shall be hereinafter unlawful to park or leave on the streets or public property of the Borough of Fountain Hill vehicles for the purpose of performing major repairs, greasing or oiling, except in case of emergency repairs.

§311. Procedure for Obtaining a Handicapped Parking Spaces.

To qualify for handicapped parking the following criteria must be met at all times:

1. The vehicle to be parked in the handicapped space must bear an HP or DV license plate issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and must be registered in the name of the applicant or another person who resides at the same address as the applicant.
2. The applicant must have a disability that severely restricts mobility: any person who is blind; does not have full use of an arm or both arms; cannot walk 200 feet without stopping to rest; cannot walk without the use of or assistance from a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetics device, wheelchair or other assistive device; is restricted by lung disease to such an extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one liter or the arterial oxygen tension is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at rest; uses portable oxygen; has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as Class III or Class IV according to the standards set by the American Heart Association; or is severely limited in his or her ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.
3. Off-street parking is not readily available for the vehicle to be parked in the handicapped space. Off-street parking means a space provided behind the street right-of-way line and provided in an attached or detached garage, carport or driveway.
4. Adjacent neighbors must be notified of the application for the handicap sign prior to the approval by Borough Council. The neighbors' notification will not determine if the sign will be posted or not but is only a courtesy notification. Borough Council may approve a sign regardless of width of the property or consent of neighbors.
5. Waiver. In cases of hardship, Borough Council may grant a waiver upon request from any subsection of this section. Borough Council may establish, by resolution, written standards and procedures to determine how cases of hardship will be handled.
 - A. As to taxes, when the collection of the tax becomes the responsibility of the Lehigh County Tax Claim Bureau.

- B. As to sewer charges, such date is 60 days after the billing date.
 - C. As to garbage charges, such date is 60 days after the receipt of the bill. In the absence of proof to the contrary, receipt of the bill shall be two business days after the bill is sent via U.S. mail.
6. The approval of a handicapped space and the erection of a handicapped sign is conditioned upon the applicant not being delinquent on any taxes, garbage or sewer fees due the Borough. "Delinquent" is defined as that point in time at which:
- An applicant may request a waiver of this condition provided undue financial hardship is established and a plan is agreed upon for the payment of any outstanding taxes or fees.
7. The Mayor and Executive Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to develop such forms, rules and regulations as shall be necessary or convenient to carry out the intent and purpose of this section. Such forms, rules and regulations shall become effective upon approval by resolution of the Borough Council.

Part 4

Snow and Ice Emergency

A. Snow and Ice Emergency.

§401. Declaration of Snow and Ice Emergency.

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named in §403 of this Part, the Mayor, in his discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (designated in this Part as a “snow emergency”). Information on the existence of a snow emergency may be given by the Borough of Fountain Hill through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

§402. Parking Prohibited.

Driving Motor Vehicles Restricted on Snow Emergency Routes During Emergency.

After any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person:

- A. To park a motor vehicle or allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated in §403 of this Part; or
- B. To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route, unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains.

§403. Snow Emergency Routes Designated.

The following are designated as snow emergency routes:

Street	Between
Both sides of Broadway	Eastern Borough line and Western Borough line
Both sides of Delaware Avenue	Eastern Borough line and Broadway
Both sides of St. Luke’s Place	Delaware Avenue and Ostrum Street
Both sides of Ostrum Street	Mohican Street and the St. Luke’s Emergency Ward driveway entrance

§404. Placement of Signs Along Streets Affected.

In order to assist the operators of motor vehicles and tractors in determining the streets affected by this Part, the Public Works Department shall place at reasonable intervals along the routes signs containing the following language:

SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTE SNOW TIRES OR CHAINS REQUIRED NO PARKING
DURING EMERGENCY VEHICLES TOWED AWAY

§405. Penalty for Violation.

1. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under §401 of this Part, a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Part, and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$75 and costs.
2. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under §401 of this Part, a person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a snow emergency route without having that vehicle equipped with snow tires or chains, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Part, and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$75 and costs.
3. In the event that it is deemed necessary to remove any parked or stalled motor vehicle or tractor which is in violation of this section, the Borough shall cause the motor vehicle or tractor to be removed and the owner or operator of such motor vehicle or tractor shall be liable for the expense of such removal and related storage.
4. The Borough hereby authorizes the Executive Secretary and/or his designee, to levy a storage fee of \$20 per day on all owners and/or operators of vehicles towed to and stored on Borough property pursuant to a violation of this Part. The Executive Secretary shall be empowered to develop any forms, rules or regulations in order to carry on the intent and purpose of this Part.

B. Rules and Regulations.

§411. Rules and Regulations.

1. The Borough of Fountain Hill has a Snow and Ice Emergency Ordinance [Part 4A] which prohibits parking and driving motor vehicles on any snow emergency route unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains. Copies of this ordinance are at Borough Hall for review by residents.
2. The Borough has an ordinance dealing with obstruction of sidewalks [Chapter 21, Part 5] which requires property owners to remove snow and ice from pavements and sidewalks within 10 hours after any snow, and prohibits persons from throwing snow upon any street, highway or alleyway that already had snow removed by the Public Works Department. Copies of that ordinance are at Borough Hall for review by residents.
3. With regard to a snow emergency, such emergency shall be declared by the Mayor and the Police Department will notify residents of such snow emergency through radio, newspaper or other media. The snow emergency will remain in effect until declared over by the Mayor.
4. Vehicles parked on the designated snow emergency route will be towed away at the owner's expense.
5. The following procedure will be followed with regard to general snow removal of four inches or more and the cooperation of residents is necessary so that the Borough can properly remove snow and make the streets safer to travel:
 - A. The day after the snowfall stops, the Borough shall plow snow to the curb on the odd numbered side of all streets and all vehicles should be removed from that side for the day or until the snow removal has been completed.
 - B. The following day, or second day after the snowfall stops, the Borough shall plow snow to the curb on the even numbered side of all streets and all vehicles should be removed from that side of the street for the day or until the snow removal has been completed.

Part 5

Interpretation

§501. Severability.

The provisions of this chapter shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional or illegal, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this chapter. It is hereby declared as a legislative intent that this chapter would have been adopted had such unconstitutional or illegal provisions not been included herein.

§502. Continuation of Prior Regulations.

The provisions of this chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances in force immediately prior to the adoption of this chapter, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and regulations and not as new enactments. The provisions of this chapter shall not affect any act done or liability incurred, nor shall they affect any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted to enforce any right or penalty or to punish any offense under any such ordinances or regulations as aforesaid.

§503. Repeal of Earlier Ordinances.

All previous ordinances and amendments dealing with traffic regulations, including but not limited to Ordinances 154, 162, 163, 233, 236, 289, and 296, are hereby repealed.

Part 6

Penalties

§601. Violation of Provisions.

1. Designation. It is a summary offense for any person to violate any of the provisions of this chapter.
2. Penalty. Every person convicted of a summary offense for a violation of any of the provisions of this chapter for which another penalty is not provided shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25, plus costs of prosecution.

§602. Inability to Pay Fine and Costs.

1. Order for Installment Payment. Upon plea and proof that a person is unable to pay any fine and costs imposed under this chapter, a court may order payment of the fine and costs in installments and shall fix amounts, times, and manner of payment.
2. Imprisonment for Nonpayment. Any person who does not comply with an order entered under this section may be in prison for a number of days equal to one day for each \$10 of the unpaid balance of the fine and costs.

Part 7

On-Street Parking Restrictions for Commercial Establishments¹

§701. Rules and Regulations.

1. Applicant shall file an application provided by the Borough and pay an initial application fee of \$75.
2. Applicant must demonstrate that the current use of the property is a permitted use pursuant to a zoning permit issued by the Zoning Officer and/or an order decreed by the Zoning Hearing Board.
3. Applicant must demonstrate that the property has no other area available for off-street parking with regards to the use.
4. Applicant must demonstrate that the proposed on-street parking will not adversely impact or displace other parking in the neighborhood. The Chief of Police must review and advise on this matter.
5. Applicant must submit a list of property owners 100 feet from the proposed requested on-street parking area.
6. The requested on-street parking zone must be in the front or side of the property. If the requested on-street parking zone extends beyond the applicant's property, a consent form must be obtained from the respective adjacent property owners.
7. The maximum number of on street parking for a property will not exceed the difference between the number of spaces required by the Zoning Ordinance [Chapter 27] for each use and the number of spaces provided or approved by the Zoning Hearing Board.
8. If the request for on-street parking is approved by Borough Council the applicant shall reimburse the Borough for the cost of the signs, installation and removal thereof.

¹ Editor's Note: The preamble of Res. 98-05 provides:

"WHEREAS, Borough Council, under limited circumstances, wishes (sic) to permit on-street parking restrictions at, on or near and for the benefit of, commercial establishments wholly located in the Borough of Fountain Hill; and

WHEREAS, it is understood that any and all restrictions are, and shall at all times be considered privileges and not rights and as privileges, such permits are revocable by the Borough at any time upon 24 hours notice to the commercial establishments; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council wishes to develop a policy for obtaining this privilege for on-street parking."

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9. The applicant shall notify the Borough of any discontinuance or change in the use of the property. The signs shall be removed by the Borough upon request by the owner or if it is determined by the Borough that the signs are no longer required for the business.
10. All requests must be made, in writing, to Borough Council and must include the following:
 - A. Name and address of the applicant.
 - B. Current location on the property.
 - C. Detailed explanation of the use of the property and parking requirements for the use.
 - D. Sketch plan showing the lot size, buildings and structures.
 - E. Other information pertinent to the request deemed useful by the Executive Secretary.
11. It is understood that the establishment of on-street parking constitutes a privilege and that at any time this privilege may be revocable by action of Borough Council.
12. The approval of on-street parking will be for a duration of one year. Following the one-year period the applicant must reapply and recertify that the on-street parking is necessary. The applicant must receive recertification from a majority of Borough Council. The Borough may charge a nominal recertification fee.
13. Applicant, at the time of the application, must have paid all Borough taxes and fees due and payable.
